Chollas Creek Drainage Channel

Along the northern boundary of Rolando Park, the Chollas Creek Drainage Channel runs between the businesses facing University Avenue and the homes with backyards that abut the channel on the south side. It is most easily visible at Rolando Blvd, just north of Vista Grande. You can see the drainage channel, which is filled with palm trees on the east side of Rolando Blvd.



Per an article in the Union Tribune on November 2, 2015:

"Vegetation in a channel may be seen as a flood risk factor by some, but Becker [Eric Becker, senior engineer for the water quality control board's Wetland and Riparian Protection Unit] stressed that plants and shrubs help filter pollution out of water and keep downstream bodies of water cleaner."

Neighbors have expressed concerns regarding the flood possibilities of the channel for some time. With El Nino rains predicted this winter, the RPCC has been in communication with the City of San Diego regarding our channel since May 2015. We made every attempt to be scheduled for maintenance in 2018, the nearest possible date, but have been unable to confirm with the City that our channel made the cut for the 2018 list.

At this time, our only resource if there is flooding associated with the Chollas Creek Drainage Channels is to take pictures of the damage and call the Storm Water Hotline at (619) 527-7500 to request emergency services.

Another hotline where you can report blocked drainage channels is (619) 235-1000.

University Avenue Improvement Group

Did you know Rolando Park's border of University Avenue spans three City blocks, one mile, from College Avenue to 69th Street? Divided into two City Districts, District 4 to the south in Rolando Park and District 9 to the north in Rolando Village, University Avenue is home to many businesses and several residential homes.

In summer 2014, a group of Rolando Park neighbors began meeting to discuss options for improving and revitalizing our University Avenue Business District. Lacking its own formal Business Improvement District (BID) and not part of the established College Area Business Improvement District, Rolando Park's stretch of University Avenue felt underrepresented and overlooked. With open spaces for lease, seemingly vacant storefronts and pockets of distressed appearance, neighbors recognized an opportunity to fill the gap between what the Business District offers and what Rolando Park neighbors want.

This informal gathering of neighbors soon turned into the University Avenue Improvement Group (UAIG) and now, just one year later, UAIG is meeting regularly once a month and gaining momentum.

In 2015, the University Avenue Improvement Group, with the support of the Rolando Park Community Council:




- Hosted a Law Enforcement Walk along University Avenue with District 4 Councilmember Myrtle Cole, Chief of Staff Jimmie Slack, and SDPD. The walk provided an opportunity to identify concerns, ask questions, and seek a commitment in helping make safety and revitalization a priority.
- Strengthened our communication with local business owners and property owners, those tenured and those new to the area. UAIG helped welcome new businesses Bourre Southern Bistro, WeiWei Asian Express, Planet Fitness, and Garden Kitchen.

- Formed relationships with liaisons from the City of San Diego, Civic San Diego, and the College Area Business District. Our liaisons shared their experiences and expertise on how to reinvigorate a business district, communicate with business owners, and identify available small business resources.
- Surveyed Rolando Park residents to determine exactly the types of businesses our neighborhood wants and would support in the business district. UAIG can now bring greater focus to future development based on the community's input.

We thank our neighbors who continue to volunteer their time and efforts toward improving our business district. Change will take time, but we're just getting started!

We also thank our Rolando Park community for welcoming new businesses along University Avenue. We have many business owners who are excited to be in Rolando Park and want to support the needs of our community. Our enthusiasm and patronage go a long way in helping our local businesses thrive.
