# September 12 RPCC Meeting – Kroc 2 Expansion

Major Rick Peacock, Corps Officer and Executive Director of The Salvation Army Kroc Center, will be our guest speaker.

Major Peacock will describe planning to date for an expansion of the Center – nicknamed "Kroc 2" – and bring concept drawings to share. He will also provide the status of available funds for the project and outline the steps still needed to implement "Kroc 2" and the tentative timeline. There will also be a Q&A at the end of his presentation and he will answer questions about the project.

The preliminary Kroc 2 plan will add an additional 17,311 square feet of "wellness center" (gym and athletic space) and 132 parking spaces underneath. Changes will be made to the "green" athletic field between the gym and the Preschool Playground on the west side of the Administration Building.

### **Walmart Grant Awarded to RPCC**

In June, Rolando Park Community Council was awarded a \$1,000 community improvement grant from Walmart Community Grants thanks to the efforts of RPCC Secretary Judy Fleishman. Judy initially approached Sam's Club to sponsor our June Ice Cream Social and was then encouraged to apply for a community grant, which she successfully completed. At our September meeting, we will be asking for member input on how best to use the grant money for our community.

#### Time commitment

Board members attend the RPCC general membership meetings, 7pm on the second Monday of the month, September through June (2 hours per meeting). They also attend 10 monthly evening Board meetings (2 hours per meeting). Board members spend additional time completing their responsibilities as described in the RPCC By-Laws.

- President Serves as the Chief Executive Officer of the Council and presides at all meetings of the Council and Executive Board.
- Vice President Presides at meetings in the absence of the President and serves as the program chairperson.
- Treasurer Collects dues, maintains the membership list, handles banking, and disburses funds as authorized by the Board. The treasurer maintains financial records, provides financial reports to the Board and the members, and is responsible for completing reports and paperwork required of the RPCC.
- Member-at-Large Voting member who takes a lead position on a task or project related to the overall interests of the RPCC.

### Options for participating on the Board

These positions can be shared by two persons willing to be a team candidate and co-share the responsibilities and time commitment of one position and represent one vote on the Board.

In addition to the Board positions, we are looking for volunteers who would be interested in publishing the quarterly newsletter, updating the <u>rolandopark.org</u> website, and updating our Facebook page.

# **Block Party**

At the January 11, 2016 annual planning meeting, RPCC members voted a Neighborhood Block Party as a top priority. Facilitator Gerrie Flaven, Lynn Edwards, Rosalie Henke, Cecile Fleetwood, and Judy Fleishman have met to plan the event for Spring 2017. There is a Neighborhood Block Party Organizers' Group on *Nextdoor*. We have had several neighbors express interest, including someone who is willing to volunteer his band at the event.

We will have to apply for a no-cost permit 60-90 days in advance of the scheduled date.

We estimate the cost to be about \$650 to include: liability insurance of \$156 minimum, \$200 plus extra insurance to rent an inflatable Bounce Toy, \$75 to rent the required street barriers, plus about \$150 for printing flyers.

Fundraising started in July with an "Opportunity Drawing" of items and services donated by neighbors (see the *Opportunity Drawing* article) Also being planned is a solicitation of foods from local restaurants for the event.

We will give an update on planning and participation efforts at RPCC general meeting on September 12.

### **New Principal at Rolando Park Elementary**



Dear Rolando Park Community:

It is with great pleasure that I introduce myself to you as the new Principal of Rolando Park Elementary (RPE) School. Previously, I was the Interim Principal for the last 6 weeks of school. The new 2016-2017 school year brings many opportunities for our students and parents to engage in quality learning activities and I am honored to lead our school and serve our community. I come to RPE with experience as a Vice Principal, a Project Resource Teacher, a Special Education Teacher, and a General Education Classroom Teacher.

I have exciting news to share with parents about our upcoming school year:

- RPE will be receiving a full-time school counselor this school year as part of a District
  pilot program. The support of a full-time counselor is critical to the development (socially
  and academically) of our students.
- RPE will also be piloting a computer one-to-one initiative that will allow students in grades 3-5 to take home their school laptops in an effort to build digital literacy and close the achievement gap.
- Even though I was informed at the end of the last school year that our Pre-K Early Childhood Education (ECE) would be removed from RPE, I have been in negotiations with our ECE Department about continuing our Pre-K program, although in a slightly different form (more information will follow).

One of my goals is to transform RPE into one of the best quality neighborhood schools in the San Diego area. I want our community to know that we are open and recruiting new students. I would like *all* of the neighborhood students to attend our wonderful little school. Because of our small size, we have distinct advantages over larger schools, such as an intimate setting where teachers really get the opportunity to know their students on a close, personal level. We have an extremely competent, experienced, and talented teaching staff who pour their hearts into educating our students.

#### **Got Cats?**


According to SpayUSA.org, one unneutered or unspayed cat can be responsible for 2,072,541 cats over an 8-year period of time. As a result, thousands of cats are destroyed each year because owners do not realize the impact that their unaltered cats can make on the cat population. Females attract males who spray urine, fight, and risk being hit by cars for the affection of a female in heat. Unwanted litters create feral cat colonies, perpetuating the further

destruction of innocent lives. Luckily, there are programs available to everyone for little or no cost. Through SNAP's Neuter Scooter, cats can be fixed for \$25 (call 866-SPAY-BUS), and stray cats can be fixed for free through the Feral Cat Coalition's Trap, Neuter & Return program (call 855-FCC-CATS).
