

RPCC general meeting - February 12, 2018

Sonia brought the meeting to order and Lynn presented the Treasurer's report. We have \$817 in revenue and 20 members so far this year.

The Rolando banners are at the printer. The unveiling celebration is planned for mid-March with food and beverages being provided by the RPCC. City officials are being invited.

Community priorities will be discussed at next month's meeting.

Traffic Division officer Mark McCullough with the Pace Car Program spoke next.

He reported that in 2016, 47 traffic tickets were issued and there were 20 collisions in Rolando Park. In 2017, from October through December there were 99 citations and 5 collisions.

He said that the Pace Car traffic safety grant pays for the stickers/decals and for officer coverage in the R.P. community. He urged residents to report speeding vehicles (including city vehicles) with the license number. He said that ongoing concerns should be emailed to him and that complaints can be filed with specific info on habitual offenders including place, time, and person (if known). He noted that tickets won't be written in a 25 mph zone unless the offender is going at least 40 mph, there are no weight limits on residential streets, and that noise from delivery trucks can be reported after 10 p.m..

Katie Sadd brought newsletters from Myrtle Cole's office.

She said that budget priorities were submitted that day and will be open for public input. Info regarding public input was given to Lynn for publication to the R.P. community.

Katie mentioned that funding for the R.P. Elementary joint-use field Phase 2 is in the list of the city's priorities. Lynn attended the City Parks and Rec. meeting where the final design for Phase 1 and 2 of the project was approved.

A question from the audience prompted her to say that the street sweeping schedule is online and occurs approximately every two weeks. She also said that the new five-year Undergrounding Master Plan is now online and there's a Story Map that shows what projects are active now and what still needs to be done.
