Often, community concerns can be immediately directed to one of the community representatives from our local or state government or Congresswoman Susan Davis' office or SDPD if present.

September 10



The Rolando Park Community Council Board now has a member, Gerrie Flaven, attending the Homeless Coalition meetings held on the last Tuesday of the month at 8 am at the San Diego Police Department Mid-City Division. The Homeless Coalition is chaired by our Community Police Liaison Officer Terry Hoskins. Participants include Mid-City Division officers plus Neighborhood Policing and Homeless Outreach Team officers and community residents. The Coalition has been a successful project between the police and neighborhood members and has been in operation for four years.

Residents and police share information about specific locations and problems related to homeless, including trash in our neighborhoods; what police or other city intervention is taking place; and what progress is being made to alleviate the situation. Most of the situations discussed have already been reported on the *Get It Done* website or app.

Please report your concerns about homeless in our neighborhood to the City of San Diego Get It Done website www. sandiego.gov/get-it-done or app. All reports about homeless made to *Get It Done* are reviewed by one SDPD officer who combines duplicate referrals and prioritizes and assigns the reports for investigation. The number of officers assigned to investigate depends on the information you provide. It is therefore important that you give a very good description of what you observe: tell how many individuals or tents/camps you've seen and give specifics about location.
