Kroc Center News

The Kroc 2 expansion continues moving forward through numerous approvals required by the city. Updates have been made to the project's plans and they have been submitted to the city for review by the San Diego Planning Commission. The Kroc Center plans to break ground in 2019, with completion some time in 2020. Kroc 2 will double the size of the Center's fitness area, provide much needed expansion to parking areas, and create an elevated athletic field.

The Kroc Center has a new tenant in its Education Building, a charter school called Crescent Learning Program, with approximately 80 students in grades K-6. The Center's annual Halloween community celebration, BOO Bash, was a huge success. Over 1,000 people attended this fun family event sponsored by United Health Care. There were lots of smiling, happy kids at the event and lots of parents expressed what a great time they had. United Health Care is also this year's sponsor of the Kroc Center's annual Kroc Fit Kids program. Students in grades 3-5 from three local elementary schools, including our own Rolando Park Elementary, receive a monthly assembly focusing on a health-related topic. They also enjoy a monthly walking field trip to the Kroc Center to engage in healthy activities and learn about fitness and nutrition. Students can then bring family members to periodic Family Fun Nights at the Kroc Center for group activities that promote a healthier lifestyle for the entire family. Over 300 students per year benefit from this program, provided free of charge.

The Kroc staff and its many volunteers are gearing up for several events to benefit local individuals and families facing challenges during the holiday season. One of the most unique is the Donovan Bike Giveaway, when two hundred local elementary children will receive brand new Huffy bicycles purchased by inmates of the Richard J. Donovan Correctional Facility. It is a great partnership between the inmates and staff. The inmates work hard to raise funds all-yearlong and the staff volunteers to build the bikes. All children will also receive new helmets and bicycle locks.

This is also the time of year to watch for The Salvation Army Red Kettle bell ringers outside stores in November and December. All monies raised by the Red Kettles provide social services for local residents year-round. The Salvation Army thanks the community in advance for giving generously to enable them to "Do the Most Good" to those facing hardships throughout the year.

Rolando Park Elementary Joint Use Park Update

Rolando Park is on track to soon have its own park! Construction is now scheduled to start in summer 2019 and be completed by spring 2020.

It provides fruit, vegetables, and other staples to families of RPE and the neighborhood free of charge. It is facilitated by the RPE Counseling Center in partnership with Feeding San Diego.

The Halloween Festival was a great success this year. Lots of unique costumes,





face paint, candy, and fun were on display that day. The Festival is an annual event organized by the teachers. RPCC volunteers helped students decorate pumpkins in the Pumpkin Patch.

The PTA has been hard at work this fall with fun events planned throughout the



year. The Turkey Trot, Trunk or Treat, and Chuck E. Cheese fundraisers have all been huge successes! And in conjunction with RPCC again this year, the Holiday Giving Tree provided one gift for every student to unwrap at home for the holidays. Thank you Rolando Park for your support!


