## **Guest Speaker**

Elkie Wills, director of community engagement at the SD Humane Society gave a very informative overview of the Humane Society and their role replacing San Diego County Animal Services in several County jurisdictions, including the City of San Diego. The following is a summary of her remarks, but use the Call Center (619) 299-7012, 7:30am-6pm, 7 days/week (except some major holidays) or the SD Humane Society website for more information.

- 1. They are responsible for the largest geographic animal humane law enforcement district in California.
- 2. Barking dogs continue to be the responsibility of San Diego City Code Enforcement.
- 3. They provide a "lost and found" registry online.
- 4. They provide numerous services some of which are: adoptions, licensing, stray animal pickup/drop off, enforcement of all animal related laws, investigation of animal cruelty/abuse, dog bite reports, behavior helpline, low cost spay/neuter and vaccine clinics, a Behavior Center for problem behaviors, Project Wildlife, assistance to low-income pet families including to homebound and homeless individuals.
