October 14 - Commercial Code Enforcement



Rolando Park Street Sweeping Schedules

Confused about the street sweeping schedule for your street? Understandable, as it turns out that many residential communities do not have posted street sweeping signs and Rolando Park has multiple street cleaning schedules. The city sweeps residential communities every other month. Some of our streets are swept on even months (February, April, June, August, October, and December) and others are swept on odd months (January, March, May, July, September, and November). And if your normal street sweeping day falls on a city holiday, it will be delayed until the next scheduled sweeping day, which is two months later.

You can go to https://www.sandiego.gov/stormwater/services/sweepschedules, scroll down to the District 4 schedule, and then open a 72-page document to look for your street and schedule. Or, you can save yourself some time because we've created a shorter version for you with just Rolando Park streets.
