Our Spring Meeting Schedule



March 9 – City Farmer's Nursery & Annual Plant Exchange

Sam Tall from City Farmer's Nursery is our guest in March. Bring your gardening ques-

tions as Sam will cover vegetable gardening and more! Sam is also bringing several items to raffle off, including a raised garden bed, a \$20 gift card, and some veggie starters. Just in time for spring planting.

Our meeting will conclude with our annual plant exchange.

April 13 - San Diego County Pest Detection

The Pest Detection program looks for exotic insects in over 9,000 traps that are placed in residential yards throughout the County for this purpose. The Pest Detection program helps protect a 1.85 billion dollar industry in San Diego County.

May 11 – Psychiatric Emergency Response Team (PERT)

Our guest speaker in May is Wes Albers from the Community Research Foundation's PERT division. PERT pairs licensed mental health clinicians with specially trained police officers to address incidents where mental health might be part of an issue needing a police response. PERT teams also partner with law enforcement homeless outreach teams (HOT) to provide proactive preventative connection to services.

Our 2020 Priorities

Every January, members suggest priorities for the coming year and then vote on their first, second, and third choices. These are RPCC's 2020 priorities as voted by members:

- 1. Traffic calming and pedestrian safety
- 2. Pocket park improvement
- 3. Increase meeting attendance and membership
- 4. More community cleanups
- 5. Community identification
- 6. Graphics on utility boxes
- 7. Little College traffic safety from University to Billman

Traffic calming and pedestrian safety has been one of our top priorities for four years. Traffic studies were conducted in 2017 and show traffic calming is needed on Aragon, Vista Grande, and Rolando. Unfortunately, we are dependant on the city to fund the installation of traffic calming and the city has not yet provided funding.

Our City Councilmember Monica Montgomery has included our requested traffic calming in her budget priorities for this next year.

Other priorities will need community volunteers. For example, we can't have more community cleanups without more volunteers. We'll be providing more information on our 2020 work plan in our Summer issue.

Zena Canyon Cleanup on April 25

Our annual Zena Canyon cleanup is Saturday, April 25, from 9 am to 12 pm. Thanks to Judy Fleischman and Janet Althaus who will be site captains again this year. The Creek to Bay event is part of I Love A Clean San Diego's countywide cleanup events. Registration opens April 1.

Please help keep our canyon clean by volunteering for this event. This year, once the cleanup is completed, the dumpster bin will be open only to the volunteers who participate in the cleanup.

RPCC 2019 Priorities

Every January, the community council makes suggestions and votes on top priorities for the coming year. Our focus is always on what our community council can do to make our community a better and safer place to live. Here's the current status of the 2019 priorities and what we accomplished this last year.

1. Traffic calming and pedestrian safety

We asked our new city councilmember, Monica Montgomery, to prioritize our traffic issues in 2019. She tried, but was unsuccessful in securing the needed funding for traffic calming. This year, it's in her Budget Priorities Memo, so we're hopeful.

RPCC did succeed in getting angled parking installed on Aragon adjacent to the Kroc Center. The angled parking provides additional street parking, including new disabled parking. As intended, the angled parking also has resulted in modest speed reductions on this section of Aragon.

2. Improve Rolando Park Business District

Initially, we hoped to get additional trash cans on University and missing sidewalks installed to at least help keep University Ave. clean. But those are not services that the city provides to business districts without additional costs. We then focused on what we could accomplish. Representatives from the city's Economic Redevelopment Department presented at our May meeting and advised us on the initial steps to create a Maintenance Assessment District and revitalize our business district. Code Enforcement also presented at our October meeting to educate us on what they can and cannot enforce in commercial areas.

Ultimately, improving our business district will take several years. But we were

able to achieve some modest improvements.

- At our request, City Councilmember Montgomery's office arranged for weed abatement on University Ave. traffic medians from College to Aragon.
- Old faded street signs were replaced.
- Our community cleanup on University Ave. greatly improved its appearance.

3. Increase membership and engagement in RPCC

We had multiple successful community events this past year:

- Participated in the spring I Love a Clean San Diego event with a community cleanup of Zena Canyon.
- Received a Walmart Community
 Grant from Sam's Club that we in
 turn used to fund summer camp
 scholarships for deserving Rolando
 Park Elementary students.
- Sponsored a *Coffee with a Cop* event at the Kroc.
- Participated in the annual community yard sale and distributed yard sale maps, RPCC tote bags and decals, and signed up several new members.
- Organized a food drive for the Kroc Center.
- Provided a holiday gift for every student through our Holiday Giving Tree project for the third consecutive year.
- Organized a successful community cleanup of University Ave in October that included more than 30 volunteers from Rolando Park, Rolando, Redwood Village, and La Mesa. This was the first cleanup of University Ave. in several years.

Kroc Center News and Upcoming Events

Kroc 2B continues to move forward, with an approved funding plan and architectural drawings in process. Architect Ken Smith is actively working on completing the drawings of the fitness and parking expansion and the outdoor soccer field to be resubmitted to the City of San Diego within six months. This exciting renovation and expansion of the Kroc Center will incorporate most of the elements of the earlier Kroc 2 plan on a smaller scale, but with the same focus: to improve the Kroc Center's ability to offer programs and services that meet the needs of a growing and changing community. The project will add 5,000-6,000 square feet to the fitness center and feature renovated locker rooms. The athletic field will be reconfigured with improved lighting and artificial turf and provide much needed

additional parking spaces near the gym. The Salvation Army anticipates that Kroc 2B will be completed in time to celebrate the Kroc Center's 20th birthday in June 2022.

4. Missing sidewalks

Last spring, we surveyed the community and identified where residents want to see missing sidewalks installed. That list was then given to our local planning group, Eastern Area Communities Planning Committee (EACPC) and was submitted to the city as a capital improvement project (CIP) priority for Rolando Park.

Unfortunately, missing sidewalks are backlogged in the city, with a current wait time of 20+ years. It could be some time before we see any missing sidewalks installed

5. Undergrounding status

In our last issue, we provided an update on undergrounding in Rolando Park. If you missed the newsletter, you can find the update on our website at http://rolandopark.org/projects/undergrounding-update/.

The area south of Marlowe to Livingston, from 69th on the east to Zena on the west, is now in the second phase of undergrounding, Environmental Planning. We expect a public hearing in 2020 that will provide an opportunity for residents to give input.

Construction in the area north of Billman will not start for several more years.
