## Rolando Park/Redwood Village Community Council Meeting Minutes November 18, 2024

Meeting called to order at 7:02 pm by Co-President Sonia Lang.

## Treasurer's Report

Sonia reported that we have 83 members including 62 renewals and 21 new members to date, totaling \$984 in membership dues and \$871.71 in donations.

#### **Nonagenda Public Comments**

- Fox Russell shared that the trash can at the entrance to Zena Canyon is missing.
- Mia Maranion asked about making donations to RPCC.
- Joanna Dullem said that she has talked with the project manager about the ongoing construction in the community (water and sewer line replacements) and that the construction team had started to put back some of the bricks that were previously removed.

#### Representatives' Reports

- Willow Lance, Congresswoman Sarah Jacobs' office Provided updates on the House back in session and the office's youth series. She also encouraged attendees to reach out to her if they were having issues with federal agencies.
- Fatima Maciel, Mayor Tod Gloria's office Fatima shared updates about the annual "Mayor for a Day" contest for students K-12 in San Diego, which invites them to submit essays or video responses on what they would do if they were the mayor. The contest's deadline is November 29th. Fatima also announced two opportunities for community feedback: an open house on enhanced trash collection services and potential new fees, and a virtual open house for the "Safe Streets for All" program.
- Officer Josh Cummings, Community Relations Officer, SDPD Officer Cummings discussed the
  closure of the homeless storage facility on Chollas Parkway and the decrease in transient activity. He
  also mentioned the ongoing issues with Chollas Parkway and the shopping centers, particularly
  Marshalls. He reported on increased patrols on Bonillo and the new store opening next to Jolar's. He
  also emphasized the importance of keeping cars and homes secure during the holiday season and
  ended his report by asking for any specific issues that needed attention.
- Roberto Marin, City Council President Sean Elo-Rivera's office Roberto provided updates on various community issues.
  - The legal action against a certain party is still ongoing, but details cannot be disclosed yet.
  - o The Chollas Creek stormwater channel at Rolando was dredged for the second time this year.

- Preparations are underway for the upcoming rainy season, with a focus on flood-prone areas like Village Green.
- o Roberto is awaiting information on the start date for the SANDAG University Bikeway project.
- Street sweeping and trash collection issues have been addressed.
- Vaccine clinic flyers were distributed by interns.
- o Roberto emphasized advocating for the community while protecting existing resources, regardless of changes at the federal level. He encouraged using the Get It Done app for reporting issues.
- o Concerns about brush in Zena Canyon and an empty parcel were raised after a recent fire, and brush abatement efforts involving goats are being coordinated with relevant agencies.
- o Roberto stressed the importance of reporting homeless encampments near brush due to fire risks.

#### Community Updates - Jennifer Bennett, Redwood Village/Lynn Edwards, Rolando Park

- Jennifer provided updates on the Redwood Village Neighborhood Watch program, which is led by Oliver and now managed by Renee. Jennifer also mentioned an open seat on the Eastern Area Communities Planning Committee for Redwood Village. Lastly, she encouraged everyone to participate in the "Get it Done" initiative.
- Lynn then provided updates and thanked everyone for their participation in the Zena Canyon cleanup. Lynn's updates are attached.



# Infrastructure Priorities – Rolando Park & Redwood Village

Groundwork supporting two of our infrastructure projects and sent a letter of support to the city:


- Purchase of Zena Canyon to create Zena Canyon
   Park open space
- Transform 60<sup>th</sup>/University vacant lot into skatepark

## University Bikeway

- Construction to begin January 2025
- Two to three years for completion
- More than 70 trees have been added to the landscape design thanks to advocacy from our communities, our planning group, and Groundwork!

# University Bikeway cont'd

- Waiting to see revised plans and where the trees will be located
- Rolando Park, EACPC, and Groundwork are working on another plan to add blue/green stormwater medians between College and Aragon







## Rolando Park Gateway

- Plans are complete, approved by RPCC members in 2023, designed by landscape architect, pro bono
- Costs for landscaping estimated at \$40,000
- Now applied for five grants, not awarded on four; waiting to hear on fifth application
- Groundwork is working with the city planning department for needed permits
- Landscaping will come first, then monument sign
